CONSIDERANDO:

Que, la Federación recurrente está solicitando al Instituto Peruano del Deporte autorización oficial, para poder participar en el 6° TRIATHLON ANUAL a realizarse en la Ciudad de Ft. Lauderdale Florida-U.S.A. el 06 de Diciembre de 1986;

De conformidad con lo establecido en el Art. 9° inc-12 del Decreto Legislativo N° 328-Ley General del Deporte y su Reglamento aprobado por D.S.N°07-ED-86;

SE RESUELVE:

ARTICULO PRIMERO.- AUTORIZAR, a la Federación Peruana de Ciclismo para que el Sr. WALTER LEDGARD BUSE, viaje a la Ciudad de Ft. Lauderdale Florida-U.S.A. a participar en el 6° TRIATHLON ANUAL a realizarse el 06 de Diciembre de 1986.

ARTICULO SEGUNDO.- De conformidad con el Art. 77° establecido por el Decreto Legislativo N° 328 y Reglamento por el Art. 76° del Decreto Supremo N° 07-ED-86 de fecha 13.03.86, el indicado deportista está exonerado de los impuestos sobre signos de aviación a que se contrae el Decreto Legislativo N° 209, sobre impuestos a los viajes y servicios del Decreto Ley 22317, -modificado por el Art. 2° del citado Decreto Legislativo N° 209 y del impuesto a los viajes al exterior de los Decretos Leyes Nos. 22317 y 24030.

Anything would have seemed wild compared to the three days of monastic isolation I had just spent in the steamy climate of the Bahamas. So, despite its *relative* normalcy, Ft. Lauderdale continued on in the chaotic tradition this trip seemed to have adopted. Harold Robinson (fifth place at 1985 USTS Nationals and winner of the New England Triathlon Series championship) and I had been set-up to stay together, despite the fact that we had never met before.

There just didn't seem to be enough time to get everything done in that one afternoon and evening before the race. We had to go by the check-in at the International Swimming Hall of Fame, go over the race course, get Harold's bike adjusted, hit the mandatory meeting, find something to eat and finally get a decent night's sleep. All this and a minimum of schmoozing filled the day and left us a little short on time. We had been forced to forgo a review of the race course—and, more importantly, how to get there. But hey, how difficult could it be to find the place?

The sun rose a little early that next

morning. Still dazed from the whirlwind dashing about of the day before, Harold and I made our way slowly to the car, thinking we had a quick, 20-minute drive to the race. As should have been expected of two people totally unfamiliar with the area, we got lost, though I must admit that I was the guy with the map. Having figured out the correct direction to follow on yet another of Florida's innumerable straight, flat roads to nowhere, we finally raced into the parking area near the swim start at "T-minus-15-minutes-and-counting." Bolting the mile-and-a-half to the transition area at a sub-five-minute pace, we passed triathlon's glittering array of current and future stars on their way out to the swim area. Fortunately for both of us, the start had been pushed back 15 minutes. Harold would get a little warm-up and I would recover from oxygen debt. He headed over to the swim, while I remained at the finish chute wringing out my sweat-soaked shirt. By the time the starter's gun went off for the first wave, my shirt had stopped dripping.

The course, which most had expected to be along the Ft. Lauderdale beach, had been moved to Weston, some 25 miles inland (west) of Ft. Lauderdale, just six weeks prior to the race. It seems the city of Ft. Lauderdale reneged on the necessary permits it had offered the folks at USTS when a "big money" power-

boat trade show asked for the facilities on the same weekend. The new course began with a 1.5k point-to-point, dog-leg right swim in a man-made moat/canal, followed by a flat, fast 40k bike, finishing with a shadeless out-and-back 10k run. Despite the hasty redesigning, the course appeared tailored for a record assault.

Paul Carter emerged from the murky water first, as he had the week before in Tampa, in a sizzling 16:47. Within 30 seconds, nine other swimmers followed, including the likes of *wunderkind* Peter Cazalet, Dave Scott, Marc Surprenant, Mike Garcia, Scott Molina and Bruce Silvano. Four-time Ironman-champ Scott flashed out of the transition zone with a group of five others. Then Molina and Silvano charged out. When the trailing duo got on the main section of the course, they found themselves escorted by the lead motorcycle. Scott and the others had been sent the wrong way out of the transition area. This untimely lapse of concentration by race personnel saddled the initial leaders with a decisive 30-second or more deficit. But at this point there was nothing anyone could do.

Back at the swim finish, Jann Girard and twin Dian led the women out of the water in 18:07 and 18:16, respectively. Within two minutes of the pair most of the contenders followed. Fortunately, they were all spared the misdirection that their male comrades had encountered. Linda Buchanan quickly moved into a comfortable lead on the bike, followed by Kim Groleau, the Girard twins and a charging Liz Bulman.

Bulman had originally planned not to compete in the event. In Ft. Lauderdale for some promotional work with her new teammates on the Tel Plus Triathlon Team, she had brought her bike along only because she didn't have to pay the usual \$40 airplane travel fee. The night before the race, she had balked at the thought of competing. "I just didn't feel mentally up for it," she recounted later. But now Bulman's winter training in California was paying major dividends as she moved her way through the field. Regardless of how she had felt before the race, she was definitely "up for it" now.

Up ahead, past the half-way point, a pack of at least 15 pro men hammered down Florida's Highway 75—all the while being monitored by not one, not two, but three course marshals. The situation was clearly in violation of the very specific rules that Tri-Fed had recently established in its new 1986 rule book. No warnings were issued, however, no judgment passed. The group was getting away with triathlon murder under the seemingly approving eyes of "qualified" officials.

When asked later about the situation, the marshals defended their non-action by saying that, "there was ample movement by the

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
