Visto el Oficio N°355-88-FPG, presentado por la Federación Peruana de Golf ;

CONSIDERANDO :

Que, la Federación recurrente solicita al Instituto Peruano del Deporte autorización oficial, para que su deportista Alicia Dibos de Rizo Patrón pueda participar en el 88° Campeonato de Damas Aficionadas U.S. a realizarse en la Ciudad de Minneapolis, Minnesota -- USA del 08 al 13 de Agosto de 1988 ;

Con las opiniones favorables de la Dirección Nacional de Deporte de Afiliados, Oficina de Asesoría Jurídica y Dirección Ejecutiva Nacional; y visto el certificado médico ;

De conformidad con el Art.9° numeral 12 y Art.77° del Decreto Legislativo N°328 - Ley General del Deporte y su Reglamento aprobado por Decreto Supremo N°07-ED-86; y con cargo a dar cuenta al Consejo Nacional del Deporte ;

SE RESUELVE :

Artículo 1° .- AUTORIZAR, a la Federación Peruana de Golf para que su deportista ALICIA DIBOS DE RIZO PATRON viaje a la Ciudad de Minneapolis, Minnesota-USA, a participar en el CAMPEONATO DE DAMAS AFICIONADAS U.S. a realizarse del 08 al 13 de Agosto de 1988.

Artículo 2° .- De conformidad con el Art.77° establecido por el Decreto Legislativo N° 328 y reglamentado por el Art.76° del Decreto Supremo N°07-ED del 13-03-86, la indicada deportista está exonerada de los impuestos sobre signos de aviación a que se contrae el Decreto Legislativo N°209 sobre impuestos a los bienes y servicios del Decreto Ley N°22317 modificado por el Art.2° del citado Decreto Legislativo N°209 y del impuesto a los viajes al exterior de los Decretos Leyes N°22317 y 24030.

Artículo 3° .- Los gastos que ocasione el indicado viaje ascendente a DOSCIENTOS VEINTIUN MIL SEISCIENTOS DIECISEIS INTIS (I/.221,616.00), afectará el presupuesto de la Federación Peruana de Golf - Recursos Propios.

Artículo 4° .- La presente Resolución NO AUTORIZA la adquisición de moneda extranjera en el Mercado Unico de Cambios.

Artículo 5° .- Al término del citado evento Internacional, la Federación Peruana de Golf tiene 15 (quince) días para emitir su Informe Técnico-Económico a la Dirección Nacional de Deporte de Afiliados, el incumplimiento a esta disposición, originará que el Instituto Peruano del Deporte no de trámite al próximo pedido de autorización de viaje al extranjero.

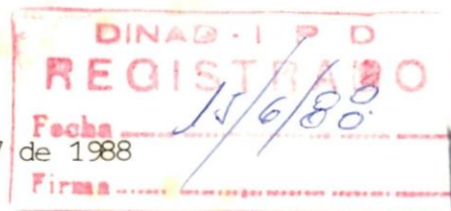

Eligibility

Entries are open to women amateur golfers with up-to-date USGA Handicap Indexes not exceeding 5.4 under the USGA Handicap System. Note: the limit is a USGA Handicap of 5 in areas where the USGA Slope System is not in use.

Entries are subject to rejection at any time (including during Championships) by USGA. The reason for rejection may include unbecoming conduct.

Schedule

Competition will be in two stages:

SECTIONAL QUALIFYING ROUNDS — 18 holes stroke play. Exempt entrants. Schedule below.

CHAMPIONSHIP ROUNDS — 144 players eligible.

The field will be increased to accommodate exempt players for whom the USGA files blank entries and players who receive special exemptions.

(A) STROKE PLAY — 36 holes stroke play to determine 64 players for match play. All sectional qualifiers and exempt players must compete. A tie for last place shall be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off.

MONDAY, AUGUST 8: — First round, 18 holes
TUESDAY, AUGUST 9: — Second round, 18 holes

(B) MATCH PLAY — General numerical draw will be used. For purposes of determining places in the draw, ties in qualifying rounds shall be decided by a blind draw, except that places of those participating in a play-off shall be determined by the order on the public score board summary and by performance in the play-off.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 10: A.M. — First round, 18 holes
P.M. — Second round, 18 holes.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 11: A.M. — Third round, 18 holes.
P.M. — Fourth round, 18 holes.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 12: A.M. — Semifinal round, 18 holes.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 13: — Final, 36 holes.

In event of a tied match, (a) the winner shall be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off and (b) the stipulated round is deemed to extend to as many holes as are required for a match to be won.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 7, 6:15 P.M. — The USGA cordially invites entrants to a reception and dinner at Minikahda Club, Minneapolis, MN.

Exemptions

Players in the following categories will be eligible for exemption from Sectional Qualifying Round.

PLEASE POST

Sectional Qualifying - 18 Holes Stroke Play

Qualifying District, Transferring

A qualifying site cannot be changed after entries close.

Qualifying Places, Ties, Substitutions

The number of qualifiers in each Section will be determined by the USGA, based on size and playing quality of the field.

A tie for the last qualifiers' place or an alternate's place shall be decided immediately by a hole-by-hole play-off.

A substitution for a qualifier unable to compete will be made in order of qualifying scores from the section in which the withdrawn player qualified.

If a qualifying section cannot fill its qualifiers' places, or if an exempt player withdraws, the place made available will be re-allotted to another section. A re-allotment schedule will be prearranged, based on size and quality of Sectional fields. Alternates have no status at Championship.

If a player withdraws on the first day of the Championship proper, substitution is allowable.

Acceptance of Places: Notice of Withdrawal

On the day of Sectional Qualifying, every qualifier should notify the Sectional official in charge whether she will play in the Championship.

If a qualifier or exempt player decides not to participate she must notify the USGA promptly. Failure to comply may result in a player being disqualified from future USGA competition.

Prizes

Sectional Qualifying Rounds

LOWEST SCORER: Silver medal; if a tie, duplicate medals awarded

Championship

WINNER: Gold medal. The Robert Cox Cup will be held for ensuing year, subject to such conditions as USGA may establish.

RUNNER-UP: Silver medal.

OTHER SEMI-FINALISTS: Bronze medals.

LOWEST QUALIFYING SCORER: Bronze medal. In case of a tie, duplicate medals will be awarded.

NO OTHER REMUNERATION: By her application, an entrant certifies that she is not entitled to remuneration of any kind for participation in Championship other than prizes above.

Entries: Form, Fee, Closing Date

Entries shall apply on USGA forms, obtainable from USGA Member Clubs and women's golf associations. (Form attached hereto.)

Eligibility of a foreign entrant must be certified by the organization governing golf in her home country.

Entry fee of \$60 will be paid by every applicant. Fee will not be refunded unless entry is not accepted or sickness prevents play, in which case request for refund must reach USGA by August 11. A \$15 service fee will be deducted from refunds.

ENTRY APPLICATIONS MUST REACH USGA

BY 5 P.M. ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 6

Applications late or incomplete are not acceptable.

(Do not telegraph or telephone)

Time limit for entry means time of receipt at USGA (not time of postmark). Entry should be mailed early to allow ample time for delay or error in transmission.

Registration

BY 2 P.M. ON SATURDAY, AUGUST 6, entrants must either:

1. Register in person at Minikahda Club, or
2. State arrival time directly to USGA Executive Director, Rules and Competitions, in care of Minikahda Club, W. 32nd St. & Excelsior Blvd., Minneapolis, MN 55416. Telephone # 612 926-1601. In the absence of such notification, USGA reserves the right to substitute an alternate.

Practice

Privileges of Minikahda Club are extended to entrants on a non-exclusive basis on August 5 and an exclusive basis on August 6 and 7.

Rules of Golf

Play will be governed by Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA. Questions shall be settled by USGA Executive Committee whose decision shall be final.

Golf Balls

Only brands of golf balls on the USGA's latest list of conforming golf balls may be used.

The so-called "One Ball Rule" will be in effect.

Caddies

Qualifying events—An entrant may provide her own caddie. If she desires the host club to furnish a caddie, she should check with Official in charge because the host club may have insufficient caddies.

Championship proper—A player may provide her own caddie (See section on caddies on entry application.)

A player is not required to employ a caddie for any phase of the Championship.

Automotive Transportation

Players shall not use automotive transportation during play. Penalty for each hole on which a breach occurs: Match play—Loss of hole; Stroke play—Two strokes.

Time of Starting

Rule 6-3a provides: "The player shall start at the time laid down by the Committee." The penalty for breach of Rule 6-3a is disqualification. However, it is a condition of this Championship, including Sectional Qualifying competitions, that, if the player arrives at her starting point, ready to play, within five minutes of her starting time in the absence of circumstances which warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification as provided in Rule 33-7, the penalty for failure to start on time is loss of the first hole to be played in match play or two strokes in stroke play instead of disqualification.

Conditions, Schedules

The USGA Executive Committee reserves the right to alter any of the conditions and schedules herein. The decision of the Executive Committee in any matter shall be final.

Accommodations, Chairmen

Information on accommodations will be provided qualifiers following Sectional Qualifying. Exempt players will receive this information from the USGA office.

Publicity, Broadcasting and Motion Picture Coverage

The USGA may arrange for pre-Championship publicity, for world-wide radio and television broadcasting and other exhibition or publication of the Championship, or excerpts thereof and for a documentary motion picture. By this application, an applicant consents to references to her and pictures of herself and her play in such publicity, radio and television broadcasting and other exhibition or publication and documentary motion picture, including their use in any commercial manner. Cooperation of players with authorized representatives of these media is required, provided that no special pre-Championship activities shall be required and provided play is not interfered with.
